The recipe for the Lemon Drizzle cake category is as follows:-

Ingredients

125g	Butter, softened, plus more for greasing the tin
	Flour, for dusting the tin
150g	Caster Sugar
2	Large, free range eggs, beaten
3 lemons	finely grated zest and juice
180g	Plain or spelt flour
2 tsp	Baking powder
4 tbsp	Milk
50g	Icing sugar, sifted

Preheat your oven to 180°C/gas mark 4. Butter and flour a 23cm non-stick loaf tin.

In a medium to large mixing bowl, cream the butter and caster sugar together with a wooden spoon (or use an electric mixer). Gradually beat in the eggs and mix until light and fluffy. Stir in the lemon zest, flour and baking powder, and mix well. Add 2 tablespoons of the lemon juice and mix well again. Then beat in the milk.

Pour the cake mix evenly into the prepared loaf tin and bake for 45 minutes.

In the meantime, mix the remaining lemon juice and the icing sugar together in a small bowl to make a syrup.

When it's ready, take the cake out of the oven and leave it to cool in its tin for 5 minutes.

Then turn it out onto a plate. Pierce the top of the cake all over with a thin skewer. Spoon the lemon syrup carefully and evenly over the cake until all of it is absorbed. Ready to eat.

The **BBQ** commences at 4pm. BBQs will be fired up and ready for you to use. Bring your own meat, knives and forks, plates, drinks. (Hot drinks: £1.00)

Although some tables and chairs will be provided, it would be helpful if some could be brought along too! A range of lovely salads and bread plus all deserts will be provided.

News from the Parish Council

The following have been duly appointed to serve on the Parish Council for 4 years.

Cllr. Richard Darbyshire; Cllr. Derek Stratton

Grateful thanks are passed on to Andrew Bull, Richard Ormston, Peter Philpott and John Allison. The village is very grateful for the huge efforts they made in serving our parish. We wish Richard well as he continues to be the District Councillor for the Lower Wensleydale ward.

The newly formed Parish Council is working on the details of a **Village Plan**. This follows the outcomes of the Village Survey. Thanks to those who came to a recent meeting to hear about the responses to the survey. Actions are being developed around the following headings:- Partnerships; Village Communication; Buildings, Planning, and Infrastructure; Highways; Green Spaces; and Wellbeing and Community Support. The draft plan will be circulated to the village in early Autumn.

Planning Issues Despite objections from several respondents including the PC, the building of a 5 bed property with studio and double garage have been approved by Richmondshire District Council (RDC), on the land next to Oak View Cottage by the village green.

The application made to RDC to develop the Green Tree Inn is still pending a decision. Subsequently, the developer has put the property back on the market, whilst awaiting a decision about the original application. In line with most respondents to the planning application, the PC outlined its concern regarding the lack of improved parking for the development, the concerns over light and noise pollution and the inappropriate building material proposed for the exterior of the extension. Whilst supporting the plans to develop The Green Tree, the PC emphasised that any such development should not be greatly detrimental to the life and environment of the village.

Drainage Issues There was recent blockage to the sewerage pipes to the east of the village. On investigation, Yorkshire Water discovered that the main sewer was blocked with disposable nappies and wipes. Please ensure that such items are not disposed of down the toilet.

Parish Clerk

At the last meeting, the council was informed that Mr. Jon MacNamara would be leaving the post of Clerk with effect from 1st January 2020. A process will now be put in place to advertise and appoint a new Clerk in the Autumn. This will allow for a period of induction alongside the present Clerk. Jon will be missed as he has provided a highly knowledgeable and diligent service to the Parish Council.
