### **Parish Council News**

### **Broadband Update**

In the August 2021 Newsletter the Parish Council requested Expressions of Interest from the population of the Parish regarding the need and desirability of faster and more reliable Broadband connections. In response to the 84 newsletters distributed, Expressions of Interest were received relating to 19 properties. Of these 19 properties 9 were in the village with the remaining 10 being located on farms or farm based residential developments.

These numbers were communicated to Openreach and initial discussions seemed to indicate that the low number and geographical spread of properties would not present a viable business case for the implementation of Fibre to the Property (FTTP). Recent issues with Broadband speed and reliability have highlighted potential problems with the current Superfast implementation. Given this the Parish Council will continue to examine other options.

An option which has recently come into being is the use of a 5G based service which offers home services of 50, 100 and 350 mbps. The last being about 10 times faster then the current Superfast service provided to the village. A company called Quickline has installed a 5G mast in Leyburn to provide this service. Details of services and prices are on the Quickline website (quickline.co.uk).

#### **War Memorial**

Many thanks to those people who have offered a donation towards the cost of the restoration of the War Memorial. It is hoped that the work will commence early in the New Year.

#### **Litter Bins**

The Parish Council is actively seeking to position some litter bins in the lay-bys on the 'tank road' close by the crossroads to the west of the village. This area is always the most problematic when it comes to village litter picks. There has now been agreement by Richmond District Council to consider further waste bin installment (and emptying). The bins will need to be purchased by the Parish Council. However, we have applied to the RDC Lower Wensleydale Partnership for a grant towards the cost of the two bins.
