Parish Council News

Since the last newsletter, the District Council Planning Committee have now approved full planning permission to the latest plans for **The Green Tree**. We await developments.

Sadly, once again, we have received irate reports of **dog fouling**. This is particularly occurring near to the village sign on Hackforth Road, and the mess has been carried into people's homes. Please be assured that the Parish Council will not hesitate to report anyone found guilty of not picking up dog waste to the District Council. They can issue a fine of £1000 to the offender. This is a health hazard. Please be vigilant.

The War Memorial, situated within the churchyard, needs some remedial works. Costs will fall around £1500 to renovate it. An application has been made to the RDC Lower Wensleydale Area Partnership Grant Scheme. There is a significant crack in the upper part of the obelisk, and it is hoped that work can be carried out to prevent further damage. However, if another upper section is required then another £1500 would be needed. We will consider asking for public support via donation when we are aware of the outcome of our grant application.

Patrick Brompton Parish Council High Speed Broadband – Expression of Interest

Context

The Village Plan contains an action to investigate the supply of a fibre-based high-speed broadband (FTTP – Fibre to the Premises) capability. Several people have expressed an interest in pursuing this and the Council now wishes to gauge the level of interest from the whole village population.

One method of implementing FTTP is through a Community Fibre Partnership (CFP) with an infrastructure provider such as BT Openreach. For such a partnership to be viable, a majority of the village population would have to commit to the scheme. The first step is ascertaining the level of interest so that the Parish Council can determine the feasibility of further pursuing the Community Fibre Partnership.

The Parish Council will therefore be grateful if you can complete the details below and return the information. At this stage any personal information will not be used by or communicated to any person or body other than the Parish Council. Please tick the box which best describes your level of interest.
